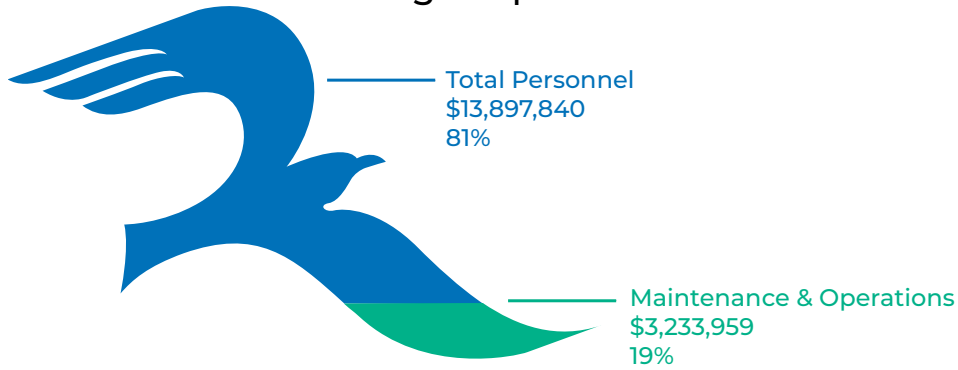

108 students earned a transfer associate degree before graduating high school during the 2020-2021 & 2021-2022 academic years.

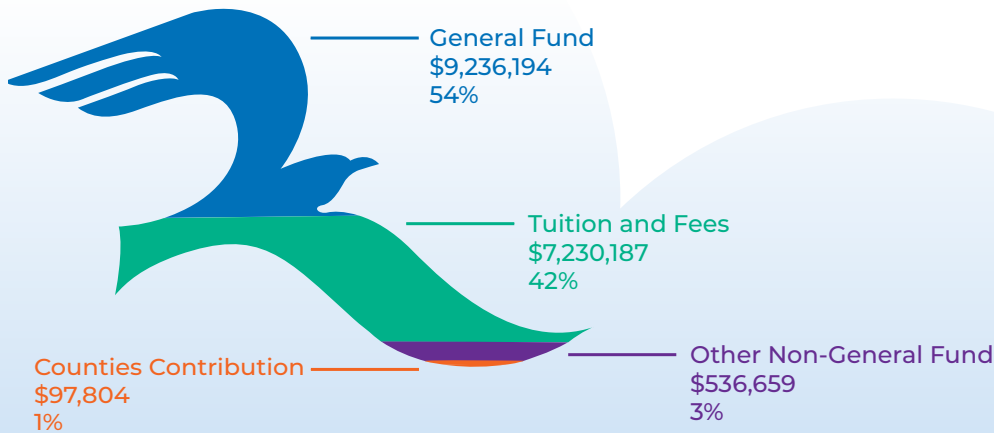
RCC's Service Region and Economic Impact

Preparing individuals for success in twelve counties

RCC's service area covers 12 counties. The two main campuses are Glens in Gloucester County and Warsaw in Richmond County.

There are four off-campus sites: Kilmarnock Center, King George Site; New Kent Site; and the Westmoreland Workforce Training Center.

Dual enrollment classes are offered at the Bridging Communities Regional Career and Tech Center, the Northern Neck Career and Tech Center, the Chesapeake Bay Governor's School, and at 14 participating high schools.



Transforming Lives and Workforce Development

RCC and its sister community colleges across the Commonwealth are leading the way in accelerating the training, credentialing, and placement of Virginians in available, good-paying jobs. Many of our programs focus on unfilled middle-skill jobs – those that require some level of credential or certification but do not require a four-year degree, which account for approximately half of the 75,000 open jobs in the state. Scholarships along with state-level tuition assistance initiatives, FastForward, G3 and the newly-unveiled HIRE Virginia program, train students at little or no cost to themselves, accelerating the time to fill these open positions.



New Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program

Identifying a need for qualified cardiac sonographers in the Northern Neck and Middle Peninsula, RCC is developing an Associate of Applied Science Degree in Diagnostic Medical Sonography with an echocardiogram specialization. Pending approval by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges and State Council on Higher Education its first cohort will enroll in the fall of 2023, pending SACSCOC and SCHEV approval. In collaboration with VCU Health, this innovative partnership program will prepare students for a career as a health science professional who produces diagnostic images of the human body using special equipment to direct high-frequency sound waves into different anatomic structures in the human body. With this two-year degree, students take state boards to become Registered Diagnostic Medical Sonographers with starting salaries at \$70,000 per year.

From RCC Welding Student to Inventor

Using the knowledge gained in RCC's welding program, Damarius Pollard devised an ingenious temperature resistant, shock absorbing and portable cargo liner that can be used in cargo trailers and vehicles of varying sizes. Damarius knew his invention could help other truck hauling companies and hired a patent attorney to get his cargo liner patented and manufactured.

Patent Number 11396169 was approved on July 26, 2022, and inventor Damarius Pollard's cargo liner has already gotten the attention of three manufacturers who will be producing the product. RCC mentor Frances Kenyear and President Shannon Kennedy could not be prouder of Damarius and his accomplishments. "This is what RCC is all about" remarked Kennedy. "Our faculty and staff like Ms. Kenyear are passionate mentors to our students. I see so much home-grown talent in our region and am thrilled about this invention and that Damarius is growing his Essex County-based business."

RCC's Strategic Approach to Enrollment

Thanks to support from federal, state, and local community grants and several key donors, RCC has dramatically expanded the number of student-facing advisors we call navigators. Starting in late 2020, we reorganized our efforts and human resources under one unit that includes all high school and college navigators. Together, this Strategic Enrollment Management team ensures that every RCC student has a designated navigator as their "person" throughout their time with us.



The "Show on the Road"

For the many students in our region who begin RCC by taking dual enrollment, that "person" is their high school navigator. In the last three years, RCC has expanded this cadre the most dramatically, from two part-time career coaches serving two high schools in 2019 to five full-time and four part-time navigators serving all 14 high schools. These high school navigators work on site with all students at their school, helping them to determine their next educational steps. Those 12th graders who identify RCC as their next destination meet and work with their college navigator (their next "person") beginning in late April, before graduation. They even get to enroll in summer and fall classes at that first meeting at their high school. During those critical four months from April to August, as they transition from their high school to their college navigator, they are in two capable sets of hands.

RCC's Philosophy

In order to serve students who first encounter RCC as adults, our college navigators have expanded their knowledge base regarding short-term credentials. They've learned how to put students in touch with their right "person" to help get them to their workforce destination and to help solve our region's workforce shortages. As a result, FastForward enrollments funded by Workforce Credential Grants rose 88% from 2020-21 to 2021-22 (from 163 to 307) and enrollments in FastForward designated courses rose 63% overall over the same period (from 239 to 389).

Early Enrollment Makes a Difference

In April 2022 RCC was able to implement the "Show on the Road" for the first time with COVID restrictions lifted and with a complete staff of high school and college navigators. In comparison with 2021, when only 17.5% of high school seniors identified as prospects had enrolled in RCC classes by Memorial Day, in 2022, 62.5% of our prospects had enrolled by the end of May. Locking in fall enrollments early enabled us to "flatten the curve" of student services throughout the summer instead of waiting for the August rush. We were able to provide meaningful orientation – virtual and in-person – throughout the summer.

Strategies for Equity and Access

Since the onset of the pandemic, we have reinvented our approach to enrollment while maintaining our core values of equity and access. As the only institution of higher education in our service region, we are keenly aware of our responsibility to connect all of our residents of all ages and backgrounds with learning opportunities. We have held seven quarterly summits with community and religious leaders since the fall of 2020 to get the word out on all that we have to offer.

New and Improved Orientation Models

In another pivot from the tradition of holding “Super Saturdays” right before fall classes, RCC hosted four “Success Starts Here: Orientation and Registration Events” in late July -- two on Saturdays, two on weekdays, two on each campus. In all, 190 new and returning students signed up to get campus tours and student IDs, nail down financial aid, work with their college navigators to build or adjust their fall schedule, and to meet other students. Many students brought family members and friends. It was a real team effort on the part of RCC’s college and high school navigators, welcome desk personnel, student ambassadors, financial aid and registrar’s office, bookstore, library, facilities, business office, and faculty. RCC folks were heartened by the steady stream of student and community members gracing our hallways in significant numbers for the first time in almost three years.

Claude Moore Foundation Support

RCC is in the second year of our association with the Claude Moore Foundation, which helped us to build, improve, and expand “health science highways” with multiple on-ramps for students in our region.

Building New Health Science Highways

At Bridging Communities Regional Career & Technical Center (which serves six counties and localities in the Middle Peninsula): RCC used Year One CMF funds to outfit a classroom at our New Kent site so that Bridging could offer a one-year Pharmacy Technician program to high school seniors. The first year, 10 seniors graduated with a Pharm Tech certification that included internships and field placements. Several of those students remain employed at area pharmacies while pursuing degree programs at RCC. Those students who went to universities out of the service region have been able to find employment off campus in pharmacies. Fourteen students are enrolled in the Bridging Pharm Tech program in 2022-23.

With Year Two CMF funds, Bridging Communities is adding the equipment and outfitting the space required to support a one-year EMS program for 2023-24 in partnership with the New Kent Fire and Rescue Squad. This program is capable of serving up to 20 students a year. This program will serve New Kent, Middlesex, Mathews, and Charles City Counties, and the Town of West Point. King William High School, in partnership with its own firehouse and with the help of CMF funds, plans to stand up its own in-house program for students who don’t want to travel to the tech center.

Improving Existing Health Sciences Highways

In Year One, we were able to use CMF funds to upfit teaching space at Gloucester High School so that their Governor’s Health Science Academy partnership with neighboring Mathews County could be expanded and held entirely in-house at GHS, rather than having its students travel to RCC or Mathews.

At Northern Neck Tech Center, a thriving Nurse Aide program is getting an upgrade in its curriculum. Using the current surplus of instructional time available, and with the help of CMF funds, Northern Neck Tech is going to nest additional Certified Medical Assistant instruction into its one-year program so that students have the opportunity to graduate with both the CNA and CMA credentials that make up the requirements to be a Patient Care Technician (or PCT).

Bridge-Building and Infrastructure

RCC led the way in incorporating the Rubin Emerge Soft Skills program (provided by the CMF) into VCCS’ Canvas learning management system, so that instructors in various Health Science programs across the system can make these modules and exercises available to Claude Moore Scholars.

We have also used CMF funds to send high school Biology and Psychology teachers back to school to get their grad credits so that they can be credentialed to teach Anatomy and Physiology and Developmental Psychology via dual enrollment, enabling students at their high school to take valuable prerequisite courses at a dramatically reduced cost. In another case, CMF is helping a teacher, who holds an Associate Degree in Nursing, to go back to school to get her Bachelor’s Degree in Nursing so that she can teach additional courses at the Northern Neck Tech Center.

Success Starts at RCC

Rappahannock Community College is the only institute of higher education in a 12-county region and as students graduate from here, they go back into our community and support our economy. Our students truly form the backbone of our workforce.

Supporting Possibilities

The following students are the grateful recipients of area scholarships. As individuals, businesses and organizations help support them, students like these give back, adding to the economic strength of our region.



In 2021, Juan faced a challenging senior year with determination. He commented, “My family works tirelessly to get me the funds that I need for college, and unfortunately, the virus hasn’t made that easy.” His math teacher at Essex High School wrote, “Juan has great skills, intellect and potential. Dr. Stuart Flanagan has devoted his professional life to teaching and much of his philanthropic life to providing low-income students the opportunity to attend institutions of higher education. Dr. Flanagan credits his parents for instilling this philanthropic spirit in him. "My parents highly valued our education and had to sacrifice for it. They were very giving to our community and giving was expected of us."

When he approached RCC about how he could make the biggest impact on students' lives, President Shannon Kennedy immediately thought of funding to build the College's Navigator Program. The extraordinary gift that established the Flanagan Family Endowment in December 2020 supports RCC's high school Navigator Program that embeds RCC success coaches or navigators in the service region's public high schools. Navigators provide hands-on advising and support to those students who are especially at risk of not enrolling in any institute of higher education, including short-term workforce credential classes, within 16 months of graduation. President Kennedy remarked, "Dr. and Mrs. Flanagan embody the mission of our College. Through their incredible generosity to RCC and commitment to education, they transform lives, strengthen communities, and inspire excellence."



The Harding Family

Collectively, members of the Harding Family have established three endowed scholarship funds at RCC. Dr. John Harding and his wife Karen, who passed away in 2009, started a scholarship endowment in 2001 to honor Karen's parents, Dr. Bruce and Mrs. Emily Martin. In 2006, the couple established a second endowment to honor Miriam W. Haynie, a friend, author, and artist who passed away at the age of 99 in that year. Dr. Harding is a leader in local educational and civic initiatives, having served on the RCC College Board and on the Northumberland County Board of Supervisors.

Dr. Harding's sister, Ms. Marion Carey Harding, a retired Richmond City Public Schools teacher, joined him in 2022 to establish the Judith Straughan Harding Scholarship to honor their grandmother for her strength, love of her children and dedication to the education of young people in Northumberland County. Over the last 20 years, 41 RCC students have benefitted from scholarships funded by the Harding Family.

President Shannon Kennedy praised the Harding Family who "show their love and respect for important people in their lives through these three endowed scholarships. What an incredible way to remember loved ones! We're grateful to this upstanding family for their generosity and commitment to our students."
